The past year has been a time of evolution and notable success. We are very proud of the impact that Community Foundation Grey Bruce is having for our region. Our grants to non-profits and charities in Grey Bruce will top \$640,000 this year. We are also proud to be administering the Canada 150 matching funding program that will assist communities in celebrating Canada's sesquicentennial in 2017. Our work is making for positive change in Grey Bruce.

We have seen the creation of many new education funds towards meeting our Smart & Caring Initiative of adding \$1 million in scholarships, bursaries, and awards. In early 2016, the Foundation was proud to launch its searchable website www.payforschoolgreybruce.com—a one stop shop where Grey Bruce students can search through 497 scholarship opportunities with access to over \$688,000 in total support available locally. A highlight of the year was the

visit of the Right Honourable David Johnston, Governor General of Canada, to Owen Sound to talk about his life-long commitment to education and to congratulate the Foundation on its education initiative.

In June, Reconciliation Canada led our Board and other community leaders through a day-long workshop introducing the powerful message of reconciliation that will be a tool in strengthening our relationships with our First Nations in Grey Bruce. This experience had resonance for all those in attendance.

We welcomed new faces to our Foundation office in 2016. In May, after a national search, we were pleased to welcome Stuart Reid as Executive Director. Shortly thereafter, Brenda O'Neill joined the team as Administrative Assistant, completing our staff complement. I would like to thank my colleagues on the Board of Directors for their continued dedicated service during times of transition, always ensuring good governance and professional support for operations at the Foundation. We are most grateful to the numerous families and individuals who have committed to their community by establishing an endowment with us. We're here for good.

New Endowment and Education Funds

Four new First Nation Education Scholarships provide post-secondary scholarships and/or bursaries to students from:

- Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation
- M'Chigeeng First Nation on Manitoulin Island
- Saugeen First Nation Band #29.
- Wikwemikong Unceded Indian Reserve, Manitoulin Island

Georgian Sound Big Band Music Scholarship - Awarded to high school students from Grey or Simcoe Counties who show achievement in music excellence and are accepted at university or college

Grey Bruce Healthcare Chaplaincy Council Endowed Fund supporting operations of the Grey Bruce Healthcare Chaplaincy Council

Janice Bye Memorial Fund - This endowed fund will support graduating high school students identified by Closing the Gap Healthcare with occupational, physical & speech language therapy and/or equipment that will assist in their post-secondary educational institute or workplace

Kimberley J. West Endowment Fund is supporting financial literacy for youth and young adult students

Leith Summer Festival Endowed Fund - An endowed fund was created for ongoing operations for the annual Leith Summer Festival held in the historical Leith Church

Marilyn Helen Fortune Endowed Fund - This fund supports the creation of residential hospice care in Brockton, the promotion of general palliative care and the provision of medical health and support services for the public in Brockton and surrounding area

that since inception in 1994, the Foundation has distributed a total of \$2,557,289 in grants to local charities. Grants, scholarships and bursaries totaling \$640,000 will be disbursed by the end of 2016.

Truth & Reconciliation

On June 22, 2016, forty prominent community leaders from Grey Bruce gathered at Harmony Centre in Owen Sound to engage in a workshop run by representatives from Reconciliation Canada. Many Elders from area First Nations were joined by representatives from governments, faith communities, health organizations, educational institutions, and cultural agencies as well as staff and Board from Community Foundation Grey Bruce.

poignantly shared their concepts of what reconciliation meant in their lives. Individuals were challenged to think about the strengths they bring to bear as local leaders and how they could address reconciliation in their community work. Through storytelling and sometimes difficult conversations, everyone confronted their role and came away with back-pocket action plans about how they would act to influence reconciliation their community. New awareness and new networks were formed during this transformational day.

The day-long workshop aimed to open up the discussion around reconciliation for our First Nations peoples in the wake of the trauma and after-effects of the Residential School System in Canada. In small groups as well as the big circle, participants generously and

2013 to 2016 Fund Matching Program: A Success Story

Over the past three years, grants of up to \$10,000 have been available to new Endowed Funds at a rate of \$1 for every \$2 donated. Provided by the Betty MacKay Memorial Fund, this incentive has bolstered many new funds with added revenue and has encouraged fund holders to maximize the matching potential.

55 funds enrolled in the program. \$398,000 of the matching \$550,000 committed has been utilized by those funds to date.
